ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

NEW ISLAND AT FRONT OF SCHOOL

After our first meeting with councillors and the CEO, Maurice we have had success with replacing the concrete island out the front of the school. Maurice contacted Main Roads and the very next day they came to discuss a plan to replace it. It was replaced on the holidays and makes a world of difference to the appearance of the front of the school.

BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT PLAN

We have just reviewed and updated the school Behaviour Management Plan. It now takes a more positive outlook with a focus on Positive Behaviour Support and displaying appropriate behaviours at school. We have generally appropriate behaviours but on occasions we do have inappropriate behaviours creep in to our school. All schools are required to have a Good Standing Policy, which is in response to the increasing incidents of violence in schools. Good Standing status begins at the beginning of each term. Please find our Good Standing Policy attached on the next page. Teachers are teaching the Good Standing Policy and will refer to it in class. Please reiterate this with your children at home and assist us to uphold this policy with fidelity at school. It is really important that students understand that it is a privilege to represent your school at excursions and incursions and that good standing status is connected to these special events. If you have any questions with regards to this policy please contact me to discuss further.

MINDFULNESS

One of our school focus areas for 2020 is Health and Well-being. In this day and age mental health is a topic that is discussed often. This year in particular it has been a topic to discuss. Kate Foster from Kids Hub Consultancy in Geraldton is coming out to our school to facilitate a four week course for our children on 'Mindfulness' I am super excited as I have participated in Professional Learning with her before and it is always very worthwhile. Kate would like to hold a parent workshop to explain about the programme and how you as parents can be on the same page as your children in this aspects of their health and well-being. I would like to know what time and day suits you best to come along to a one hour session with Kate. I will send an expression of interest out to gather this feedback.

SPORT CARNIVALS TERM THREE

The CHUNA Picnic Sports Carnival will be held at Chapman Valley this year on September 4th, although Yuna will run it. Yuna's oval has had some upgrades done and it is not yet ready for use. As student numbers are declining in our small schools we have invited Binnu to join with us in the Picnic Sports Carnival.

Good Standing Policy

Good Standing Policy

At Chapman Valley Primary School we Strive to Achieve everyday. At Chapman Valley Primary School our *Good Standing* Policy supports our Behaviour Expectations and Values. We reward exemplary behaviour, work ethic, attendance and the ability to display the behaviour expectations of our school

We believe that learning is enhanced in a welcoming, inclusive, caring and collaborative environment free from any form of distraction, intimidation or violence. Our *Good Standing* Policy emphasises the importance of students taking responsibility for the choices that they make on a daily basis, which impacts academically and socially on themselves and others.

Our *Good Standing* Policy is part of and works in conjunction with our whole school Behaviour Management Plan and the Department of Education's Keeping our Workplace Safe initiative. It aims to provide regular acknowledgement and recognition for the majority of students who consistently behave and act according to Chapman Valley's plans and policies

"Good Standing" is a status at Chapman Valley that all students are granted at the beginning of each term.

To maintain Good Standing students must:

- Demonstrate our Behaviour Expectations consistently
- Comply with Chapman Valley's Behaviour Management Plan
- Comply with classroom procedures
- Follow the dress code policy
- Contribute to the Happy Chappy bucket with raindrops

Students who maintain their 'Good Standing' are eligible to participate in Happy Chappy days and all other special events.

Student may lose their Good Standing as a consequence of:

- Three referrals to the Principal for classroom behaviours, recorded on SIS, parents notified
- Three referrals to the Principal for playground behaviours, recorded on SIS, parents notified
- Three 'time on bench' episodes, recorded on SIS and parents notified
- Suspension

Students who lose their 'Good Standing' may lose the privilege to participate in special events in that term, such as Happy Chappy Day, incursions, excursions or camps.

Responsibility

- It is the responsibility of each student to maintain their 'Good Standing'.
- Parents and carers will be informed when their child is at risk of losing their Good Standing.
- All decisions relating to 'Good Standing' will be at the discretion of the Principal after consultation with the classroom teacher.

EVALUATE OURSELVES

As parents and educators, we play a huge role in a child's character development. So we need to ask ourselves regularly: are we self-aware enough of our own temperament in order to allow children to learn at their own speed? Do we actively listen? Are we compassionate, respectful and empathetic? Do we empower them to solve problems rather than rushing in to solve it for them? Do we honour their spirits, giving them enough space to be who they are?

TALK ABOUT PEACE

Ask children what they think it means. You may be amazed by their answers! In turn, they will be surprised to learn that peace can be found in many places, and does not only refer to world peace.

GRACE AND COURTESY

How to greet someone, when to say 'excuse me', asking for help politely, cleaning up after yourself, knowing what to do if you are feeling angry, knowing how to tell someone you want to be alone, understanding the concept of agreeing to disagree, sneezing or blowing your nose correctly—these simple things provide the framework for modelling peace.

RESPECT DIVERSITY

Emphasise respect for the diversity of traditions and customs of people of other cultures.

PRACTISE GRATITUDE

Ask questions to get children thinking of all the things they have to be grateful for. Encourage them to record one thing each day they feel grateful for.

PROVIDE A QUIET CORNER

Even the most extroverted person needs a space to be able to slow down. Ideally it is a corner with natural light, a comfortable chair or cushions, maybe a book to read or headphones for music to listen to. Or it may be a designated outdoor space. The possibilities are endless.

REDUCE, REUSE, RECYCLE

Teach children ways to care for the environment and reduce waste in order to keep peace with Mother Earth.

FORGIVE QUICKLY

Nursing a grudge is wasted time. Show children how to let it go and get on with things.

A CARING MINDSET

Children come to understand the importance of peace by learning to take care of their home and classroom, as well as others around them. Give children meaningful tasks that are beneficial to their home and classroom.




Apply now to enrol your child in Kindergarten.

Dear Parents

Your school board operates with 5 Parent Representatives and terms last 3 years. Parents can complete more than one term however positions do need to come up for election. A position has recently come up for election. I am calling for nominations to fill this position.

What is a school board and what does it do?

All Government schools in Western Australia have a School Board or Council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions (governance) of a school within centrally provided guidelines.

The Independent Public School board is a signatory to the Delivery and Performance Agreement with the Principal and Director General. There is also an expectation that the board participates in the external review of the school that is undertaken by the Department of Education Services in the final year of the Delivery and Performance Agreement.

An unincorporated board uses approved terms of reference to define its way of working and to meet the requirements of the legislation. Please find the most current information pack and FAQ available here: https://www.education.wa.edu.au/school-councils-boards

Who is on the school board?

There are three possible categories of membership:

A mandated elected Parent category. More than one third of the total members must be from this Category – in our case, 5.

A mandated elected Department of Education employee category. Members of this category may make up no more than one third of the total membership of school Board – in our case, 3.

An optional Community Member category. Its members are appointed by a decision of the Board because of their special skills, interests or experiences – in our case, 2.

Why is Parent membership so important?

Parents on a school board provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school.

How can you become involved?

Nominate or vote! Ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant.

Do I need special experience to be on school board?

No. What you do need is an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

Induction

There is an induction for new members prior to the first meeting with the Chair and principal. Further training is available upon request. Ongoing support is provided throughout the tenure as members become aware with the governance role.

Frequency & Time of Meetings

Meetings are held once per term between weeks 6-8 on a Monday evening commencing at 5.30pm and lasting for a maximum of 2 hours.

What do you need to do to stand for election?

If you decide to stand for election, please complete the nomination form and submit to the Manager Corporate Services or Principal via email or in hard copy. Department of Education employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not employed are eligible to nominate as parents for the School Board where their child is enrolled.

If there are more nominations received than there are vacancies on the School Board, a ballot will be conducted during the weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

Remember

Ask at the school for information if you would like to stand for nomination/election and are not sure what to do.

Be sure to vote in the elections.
