Special Needs

Students with special needs are catered for within the classroom program with individual education plans (IEP's). Our school uses tiered intervention strategies to cater for differentiated learning.

Support can also be accessed through a school psychologist, speech pathologist, occupational therapist, physio therapist and the school nurse if required.

Medication

By regulation, teachers are not permitted to administer any medication, e.g. Anti-biotics, Panadol or Nurofen without a Student Medication Request / Record form having been filled out by a child's parent. These are available at the office for parents. Under no circumstances should a child's medication remain in their school bag. The teacher should be notified by letter, phone or verbally that a child requires medication whether it be for a day, a week or long term.

Common Illnesses

Children who are unwell need to be kept at home. This is the best place for recovering and does not place other students or staff at risk. The following exclusion times from school are recommended for common ailments, as taken from Department of Education regulations:

CHICKEN POX - Where no medical certificate is available, re-admit after 7 days if well.

MUMPS - Where no medical certificate is available re-admit after 14 days.

RINGWORM - Re-admit on medical certificate that the child is no longer likely to convey the infection.

RUBELLA - Where no medical certificate is available, re-admit when there are no longer symptoms.

SCABIES - Exclude until examined and found non-infected.

WHOOPING COUGH- Exclude until 5 days after an appropriate antibiotic treatment

IMPETIGO (School Sores) - Where no medical certificate is available admit if under treatment.

PEDICULOSIS (Head Lice)- Exclude from school until treated and all lice and nits have been removed. Head lice information is available for treatment.

PAROVIRUS (Slapped Cheek Syndrome) -Spread by exposure to airborne droplets from the nose and mouth of infected people. Contagious a week prior to the rash appearing. No specific treatment required.

CONJUNCTIVITIS - Exclude from school until discharge from eye has ceased.

Immunisation

The Department of Education fully supports the Health Department of WA in ensuring that children entering school are fully immunised, particularly against measles, mumps, diphtheria, tetanus and polio. (Please note that when measles are confirmed at school, children not immunised will be excluded for 14 days).

Our Behaviour Management

Our Behaviour Management revolves around the Positive Behaviour Support Framework. It assists in providing a happy, safe and positive learning environment, in which every child knows and understands the behaviour expectations. Positive Behaviour Support Framework enables our school community to have consistent language related to behaviour across the school.

The Behaviour Management Plan revolves around a Behaviour Matrix that has all behaviour expectations set out. These expectations will be targeted and explicitly taught throughout the year.

As part of our Behaviour Management Plan we follow our Behaviour Flow Chart for inappropriate behaviour. Staff will endeavour to keep in contact with parents in regards to inappropriate behaviour. When required students will be required to complete a reflection sheet that they will bring home for parents to discuss and sign.

The staff at Chapman Valley Primary School have an open door policy and welcome any discussions with parents with regards to the behaviour of their child.

Good Standing Policy

As part of the Behaviour Management Policy we have a Good Standing Policy. Every student begins the year with Good Standing. Students continue with Good Standing unless they have continual behavioural indiscretions that lead to 3 or more reflection sheets being completed in a term. When this occurs the student may miss out on special events. Parents will be notified when students fill out the reflection sheets.

KOOEE Rewards

The students can earn raindrops which go into a draw at the end of the fortnight at BEARS club. These raindrops can be awarded for student displaying appropriate behaviour and upholding the expectations of our school; Kindness to others, Kindness to ourselves and Kindness to the environment, everyday.

Devices

Students are no permitted to bring mobile phones and electronic devices to school.

Any student who requires emergency contact with parents after school hours can make an arrangement with the principal with regards to having a device on the bus.

The students will sign an Use of It Devices contract at the beginning of the year and review the contract each term for class use of IT.

The information will be communicated to students at school assemblies and by the classroom teacher. Parents will be informed via the newsletter.



School Context

Chapman Valley Primary is a Level 3 school located in Nabawa, 453km North-East of Perth or 40km North-East of Geraldton, belonging to the Mid-West Education region. Surrounded by fields of wheat, sheep, lupins and canola, our school hosts 32 students ranging from Kindergarten to Year 6. We have two classes, one for our K-2 students, and one for our Years 3-6 students. Families attending Chapman Valley Primary School come from the farming and broader community of the surrounding district with a diverse range of socio-economic backgrounds. Two school buses provide transport for out of town students.

Our school is very well resourced. All students have access to technology in the form of IPAD or laptop. Playgrounds provide a wonderful place for students to enjoy themselves, with a large focus on 'nature play' within our gorgeous nature playground, where students can build cubbies, climb, jump, create, play and explore.

Home Reading

Students are expected to complete home reading each night in order to achieve reading milestones in their reading log. The requirement is 5 nights reading per week. On Friday the students will receive an extra raindrop for their 5 nights reading. Students receive a certificate for each 25 milestone they reach in their reading log. When they reach the terms milestone you child will receive a book prize.

Camps

It has been the tradition that every second year the school organises a school camp for Room 3 (Years 3-6) students. The next camp will hopefully be in 2021. In addition, Year 6 students attend a two day leadership camp early every year in Geraldton.

In-Term Swimming Lessons

There are five double swimming lessons held at the beginning of Term 1 every year for PP-Year 6 students. The students travel to Geraldton to the Aquarena for these lessons. The fee charged covers the bus travel and entry into the pool for each student. The exact fee for swimming will be announced late at the end of each year or on the first day back of the following year. Interm swimming fees can be paid with school contributions or separately.



NCVISSA and School Sport

Chapman Valley Primary School, together with other

small schools, takes part in summer and winter sports carnivals, swimming and athletics carnivals as part of the NCVISSA (Northampton Chapman Valley Inter-School Sports Association). In addition, sport coaching Sporting Schools Grant may be provided in a range of sports during the year, including soccer, basketball, tennis, cricket, athletics and football. The coaching aims to enhance the physical education program that teachers provide each week.

In term 3, Chapman Valley, Binnu and Yuna Primary combine to participate in Picnic Sports. This is a day where students compete to determine the NCVISSA interschool athletics teams. It is also a fantastic day where our communities come together for a day of fun and friendly competition.

School Uniforms

Students are expected to wear full school uniform to school and on school excursions as it fosters school identity and pride. New and second-hand uniforms are available through the office. For health and safety reasons, thongs and slip on shoes are not permitted.

SUMMER: Maroon school T-shirt, shorts and skorts. School hat, firm fitting sandals or shoes and socks.

T-Hats

We encourage students to wear hats when outdoors, all year long. Chapman Valley is a registered Cancer Council Sun Smart School, which means that we have a 'no hat, play in the shade' rule, should students forget to bring a uniform hat to school. Maroon, widebrimmed hats are available from the office for \$15 each. Hats will not have graffiti on them at all.

Scholastic Book Club

Students will be given the opportunity to purchase books each month through Book Club. Order forms and money need to be returned to the office by the due date.

Attendance and Absentee Notification
