They also help decide on the new behaviour expectation and tick it off on the matrix schedule. The leaders also change the expectation on the chalk boards as a visual reminder for the students. The leaders then organise and run BEARS club. It is a great experience for them to be involved in a meeting.

## HEALTH AND WELLBEING-GROWTH MINDSET

One of our school focus areas this year is Health and Wellbeing. Such a great, well chosen focus considering the COVID experience we have been enduring this year. Mental health is a focus in many schools now days and is even more apparent this year.

One of the programs we have chosen to introduce this year is working on Growth Mindset strategies. I have been working with the senior class to develop a culture of a Growth Mindset. Mrs Patten has been using The Big Life Journals that focus on mental health and well being as well.

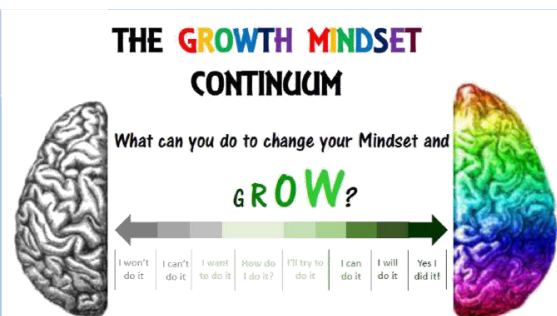

## COVID UPDATE

As of Monday 8th June WA Public schools welcomed parents back on site. We have had a few parents touch base at school which has been lovely. **Limit on non-work gatherings raised to 100 people**  
Indoor and/or outdoor venues with multiple, divided spaces may have **up to 300 people**, with up to 100 people in each space

- Beauty therapy & personal care services
- Use of playgrounds, skate parks & outdoor gym equipment
- Full contact sports & training
- Gyms (with staff) & all fitness classes
- Galleries, museums, zoos, theatres, cinemas, concert venues, arcades & amusement parks
- Restaurants, cafes, bars and pubs can serve alcohol without a meal

The capacity rule has been changed in WA to 2 square metres per person

We will continue with our COVID cleaning until at least the end of the term. This means we have a full time cleaner all day who is wiping hard, high touch surfaces on a frequent basis following a schedule. This week we welcomed Kade Daw to our cleaning team to join Dezi and Jay Rayner who have been rotating the COVID cleaning. We are also practising good hygiene which involves handwashing before we eat, after we eat, before class and before we get on the bus. We are also encouraging using sanitiser, although following Department of Health guidelines, handwashing is the preferred option.

We talk a lot at school about feelings and recognizing our 'early warning signs' that tell us when we are feeling anxious and unsafe. Feelings like having butterflies in your stomach, increased heart beat or shaking, to name a few. The point is that everyone feels anxious at some time and it is a normal reaction to confronting situations.

Is your child experiencing anxiety? How can you help?

- Acknowledge your child's fear, believe them, take it seriously and let them know that you are there to support them.
- Gently encourage them to face their fear but don't be pushy! Perhaps set some smaller steps to help them approach the fear.
- Don't make a fuss over avoidance of the fearful situation. It will take time and patience.

The answer is of course to talk together as a family about experiences and giving each other love and support.

Until next time, remember, love each other in practical ways! I am on site at school **each alternate Monday**...I look forward to chatting with you!
