Dear Parents and Community,

Welcome back to the school year. By now we are well and truly into school routines and have great expectations for 2021. We have had a very smooth start to the year and all our students have had a positive start to the year. We welcome the Willett family to our school along with two new Kindy families, the Forbes family and the Readett family. Our student numbers are at 22 with three Kindy students. Our school is loaded with 19 boys and three girls. Such a joy to be part of the 2021 year.

STAFFING

We welcome Mrs Fiona Parker in the Junior class and Mrs Rebecca Bell in the senior class. Already the teachers have put in place solid routines and practises in their class to enable our students to make the best progress they can. We have welcomed Mrs Jay Rayner and Mrs Kate Symes who are fulfilling Education Assistant duties and some COVID cleaning duties. We have farewelled Mrs Jan McCagh as she has retired and Mrs Trish Haneveld is on well earned Long Service Leave until the middle of term two. We will have a retirement function later in the term.

SMALL SCHOOL HUB DAYS-SSH Days

In 2019 the Principals of the small schools around us formed a Small School Hub (Ssh). These schools include Binnu, Yuna, Walkaway and Mingenew along with our school. These schools have similar numbers, similar budgets and similar staffing so we have made this Small School Hub to offer support and sharing of resources to better cater for our students needs. I have already raised this innovation at Board and P&C meetings and in the newsletter last year and had many discussions with parents and staff about our proposed Ssh days. As our budget is very tight in 2021 the smallest and closest of the three SSH schools, Binnu, Yuna and Chapman Valley will be having combined days on Fridays. On these days the students will be split into clusters of year groups, so PP-2, 3/4 and 5/6 groups and they will rotate around different learning areas. On this day Mrs Maver from Yuna will instruct Physical Education, Mrs Barnes along with our Chaplain Mr Hanrahan will instruct the group in Health and Wellbeing and I will instruct in music and dance. These days will be a great opportunity for our students to create more friendships and work with more students of their own age. It allows our school to pool human and financial resources to deliver learning in a variety of areas. This term we will have three Fridays as listed in the Dates to Remember section and next term we will do six days together.

SUSTAINABILITY

The sustainability program in our school continues to grow with the addition of the CONTAINERS FOR CHANGE bin outside the library. Thank you so much to community members who have already been donating CONTAINERS FOR CHANGE to our school. The students have discussed what they would like to do with the money fundraised from this venture. Some ideas include bikes for the older kids, ninja rope course, cubby house and monkey bars. CLASS TIMETABLES

The class teachers all have a timetable of learning areas. They will send these home with class information soon. I have put a whole school timetable in the newsletter for your reference. Just remember things do change and we need to be flexible with our timetabling as things do pop up from time to time. The weekly happenings which is coming out in our Chapman Chatter newspaper will notify you of week to week changes. It is important to note that both classes have a two hour literacy block from 8.50 am and students need to be on time at school to begin this. Both classes also have a maths block that runs for an hour after recess four days a week.

BUDDY READING

We have commenced buddy reading this week where the senior and juniors have a buddy. They both have to read to each other and the Juniors all read to an adult every day. We are listening to as many seniors read daily too. It is very important that the students are all completing practice reading at home and recording it in their log book. The expectation for every student is that they are reading for ten minutes at least five nights a week, or for the beginning students they are being read to five nights a week.

LANGUAGE

We have now completed two weeks of learning our Language, Indonesian. The senior room students are completing these lessons online using Webex and it is conducted through School of Isolated Distance from Perth. Our teacher is Ibu Karen and she has been very patient while we individually learn to use the technology. We are learning great skills with technology as well as the language. Each student has their own head set with a microphone and their own device.

Positive Behaviour Rewards and Incentives

KINDNESS RAINDROPS

At Chapman Valley Primary School students earn KINDNESS raindrops for displaying expected and appropriate behaviours. The raindrops are given out by any staff member.

Each fortnight to coincide with BEARS club, raindrops are collected, tallied for each individual and counted. The raindrops are transferred to pom poms that are collected in our HAPPY CHAPPY bucket. At BEARS club a draw is conducted and the winners of each of the 3 different KINDNESS raindrop draws, wins a prize from the prize box.

Students earn an extra KINDNESS raindrop for reading 5 nights per week.

Students earn an extra KINDNESS raindrop for attending school 5 days in the week.

HAPPY CHAPPY DAY

The KINDNESS RAINDROPS are counted and exchanged for pom-poms that are put into the HAPPY CHAPPY bucket. When the bucket is filled we have a whole school reward of HAPPY CHAPPY DAY. The HAPPY CHAPPY activities are decided in consultation with staff and students. Ideas may include dress up day, shared luncheon, excursion or incursion.

EFFECTIVE VERBAL PRAISE

At Chapman Valley Primary School students will receive immediate and specific verbal praise. to reinforce the appropriate behaviour choice. For example Great job for putting your hand up to speak.
