The crisis certainly has made all people look at different ways of approaching our way of life and maybe we may make some changes to our daily lives to being more grounded. COVID-19

As we are now at the end of week three it seems our school and community are getting back to normal. The Minister's announcement yesterday of all children back to school as from Monday, except for medical reasons, will see even more normality from next week. Schools are a safe place to be as we are being guided by the most recent and up to date health advice from the AHPPC.

At school we are promoting good hygiene practises including handwashing with soap multiple times a day, use of sanitiser, coughing and sneezing into elbows and limited contact. We are still asking parents and carers to remain off school grounds. If you need to drop something off or pick up your child please ring us and we can arrange a staff member to meet you at a gate. Thank you to everybody for being vigilant with this request.

We have received funding from DoE, increasing our cleaning schedule to have a cleaner onsite, all day, everyday.

RETURNING TO SCHOOL

Helping your child with worry and stress

Your child may be feeling a bit worried about returning to school. Here are some tips to help them get back into it.

Get back into a routine: set bed times, help your child to pack their bag or choose their lunch, and lay out their

TALK WITH YOUR CHILDREN ABOUT HOW THEY ARE FEELING. LISTEN AND REASSURE THEM. TALK ABOUT COVID-19, AND ANSWER THEIR QUESTIONS AS HONESTLY AS POSSIBLE, THIS MAY HELP TO ADDRESS THEIR FEARS AND REDUCE ANXIETY.

<u>Lots of detail can be</u> calming: talk them through their day: where you will drop them off and pick them

Remind them what they can do and what the school is doing to keep them safe:

- Washing/sanitising hands before eating
- Washing hands after using toilet
- Try not to touch their face or other people.
- School is being cleaned well everyday.

"When little people are overwhelmed by big emotions, it's our job to share our calm, not to join their chaos."

Reflect on how you <u>are feeling.</u> Kids pick up on their parent's emotions very easily. Modelling calm ehaviour and ton of voice can really help.

Remind them what they like about school: Their teacher Playing with A subject they

KEEP SENDING YOUR CHILD TO SCHOOL: AVOIDING SITUATIONS THAT MAKE US FEEL WORRIED CAN MAKE THE WORRY WORSE NEXT TIME.

Leave them quickly - even if they're upset. even if you're upset.

Teachers can manage your child once they are at school. Most children recover quickly once they're back in the class.

PRAISE BRAVE BEHAVIOUR: TELL YOUR CHILD HOW PROUD YOU ARE THEY WENT TO SCHOOL AND ASK THEM WHAT GOOD THINGS HAPPENED AT SCHOOL.
